BEAUTIFICATION A. Higginbotham

- Indigenous Crosswalk
 - Original plan was to reveal it on Sept 29th with the walk, due to technical concerns this was done on August 29th.
 - There is some discolouration, but this is part of the process.
 - C. Speck reiterated this was funded by sponsorship.
 - A. Higginbotham noted that we had applied for funding, but we were unsuccessful and went for corporate sponsorship.
 - C. Speck asked why representatives of the WDBIA didn't speak. K. Jones and A. Higginbotham noted we did not speak because the goal was to highlight the Indigenous people and not the WDBIA.
 - C. Setaram asked how the conversation and relationship to Indigenous issues will be continued
 - A. Higginbotham noted that the relationship with the FENFC will continue into the future, and we have a goal to grow relationships with other Indigenous orgs.
- Bridge 13 lighting
 - O Looking for funding to pay repairs for the lighting of the towers.
 - C. Speck supports the need to light this as an icon in Welland and will support the repairs.
 - B. Herchmer noted a grant that may be a good fit for this project (Gov of Canada Rural Economic Development)
